

2750-60: **Why** this Walkaround model?

1. The 27 offers a **mid-cabin** with comfortable space for two adults which, together with the double convertible berth forward, provide an overall four-adult accommodation.

Competitive boats are mostly offered with one double berth and sometimes with a single mid-cabin.



2. The 27 offers a **large aft cockpit and complete galley** in a well studied layout to provide, practical and social area for lounging.

Competitive boats are usually offered with a narrower, more compact and limited use space aft.



3. The 27 features a **wide beam hull** that provides excellent stability and improves interior space.

Most competitive boats are using a hull that is narrower by 20-30cm which has an unavoidable effect on stability.



4. The 27 is offered with standard **bow pulpit and concealed windlass location**. The pulpit provides good clearance for the anchor, improves cabin interior space and adds to the aggressive look of the boat. The concealed windlass ensures unobstructed and safe bow access.

Competitive boats offer a more plain solution with external windlass mounting and bow roller.



5. The 27 offers an **optional styled, double skin hardtop** with stainless frame that extends well aft for further coverage. Side enclosures can be added for protection of cockpit against weather elements.

Competitive boats offer cockpit coverage with slimmer, more plain hardtop options or soft tops.



6. The main cabin of 27 features a **convertible U-shape salon with styled table** that is convertible to twin berth. When the berth is not in use, extra storage space is provided at bow.

Competitive boats use simpler, lower cost arrangements with bench and one piece table.

7. Cabin interior of 27 features **real walnut floors and furniture** with glued joinery to ensure robustness and solidness in the demanding load conditions when the boat is at sea.

Competitive boat interiors are usually made using plain wood-finish panels that are joined with screws.



8. The 27 features **styled side deck mouldings with real teak tops** in the aft cockpit, underneath of which two side pockets provide extra storage. In addition, deck fittings such as rodholders installed in this area are drained safely into the cockpit.

Competitive boats adopt a more plain arrangement for the aft cockpit with less storage and limitations on the type of deck fittings that can be installed.



9. The 27 offers standard a **styled and fully functional cockpit galley** with bench level cooking and washing facilities, and plenty of storage under.

A frequent layout on many competitive boats is a cockpit sink and locker underneath.



10. The 27 offers **excellent cabin ventilation** even for the mid-cabin and toilet/shower compartment, with five standard portlights that include curtains and a cabin roof hatch.

Competitive boats mostly use two or three portlights and sometimes a roof hatch.



11. The sterndrive version of 27 offers standard a **very large swim platform** with optional solid teak covering that can carry a small size dinghy without a problem.

Swim platforms on most competitive boats are of much smaller size.



12. The 27 offers a **generous list of optional features** that enable the owner to decide and develop the boat layout according to his needs.

Competitive boats of this size offer limited flexibility on modifications to match different owner needs.
